Children participating in a Hershey district track and field meet and who may require accommodations such as an aide, wheelchair access, or an interpreter must contact the district or state meet director at least one week prior to the event so that provisions can be made.

# II. Hershey Mission Statement & Program Rules

## Hershey Mission Statement:

To provide a quality recreation and school program where children have fun and are introduced to physical fitness through basic track and field events such as running, jumping and throwing.

***NOTE: The Official Rules of Hershey's National Track and Field Youth Program will govern all events.***

## A. Age Eligibility

The participant's age must be between 9 and 14. The competitor's age group is determined by the participant's age on **December 31, 2009**. The 9- and 10-year-olds must have been born during 2000 and 1999, the 11- and 12-year-olds during 1998 and 1997, and the 13- and 14-year-olds during 1996 and 1995; i.e., if a child is 12 years old at the time of the meet, but his/her 13th birthday is on December 31, 2009, that child will compete with the 13- and 14-year-olds.

## B. Eligibility

1. All participants must reside or attend school in the sports district in which they intend to compete unless previous permission has been granted by the MRPA to participate in another district. The community representative must contact MRPA 10-days prior to the district meet.
2. Participants may compete in only one district meet.
3. Participants disqualified for unsportsmanlike conduct will be prohibited from competing in any remaining events and must forfeit any previously won awards.
4. Participants must compete in their own age group. This includes relay teams - no exceptions.

## C. Event Participation

1. An individual may enter as many as three events in each of the local or district meets. When three events are chosen, at least one running **and** one field event must be included.
2. Children participating in a Hershey Track Meet and require accommodations such as an aide, wheelchair access, or an interpreter must contact the local, district, or state meet director at least one week prior to the event so provisions can be made.

## D. Equipment

1. Participants may not compete in their bare feet, slippers or socks. However, the Aqua sock (or similiar footwear) is permitted. Shoes designated for spikes are not permitted - even without the spikes. In field events, any shoes designed for turf sports are not allowed. Jewelry, hair beads and decorations, sunglasses, and hats are not allowed while competing.
2. The use of starting blocks is not permitted. This includes using another individual's foot for a starting block.

## E. Relay Races

1. Teams must register by individuals' names and town represented.
2. In the sprint relay, outgoing runners waiting for the baton must take positions and begin running **inside** the exchange zone (20.11 meters, 22 yards long). The baton must be passed within the exchange zone (it is the position of the baton which is decisive and not the position of the body or limbs of the competitor). Participants are not allowed to mark any area of the exchangezone.
3. ***The acceleration zone will not be used.***

## F. Field Events

Participants shall report promptly to the event judge at the designated location when the event is announced. A participant shall be charged with an unsuccessful attempt if he or she does not complete a trial or pass it within two minutes after being called unless excused by the event judge to participate in another event.

# III. Participation and Pre-Registration

## A. Local Meets — The Key to the Success of the Hershey Program

All participants at the local level may also participate at the district meet level. However, directors who desire to take only the top finishers from their local meets to the district meet due to travel expense have the option to do so.

Local meets should be held so that participants have a chance to practice for district meets and become accustomed to the manner in which the meets are being conducted. This results in a more smoothly run district meet.

A publicity guide and video on the National Hershey Program are available to interested communities. Contact the MRPA for more information.

## B. Pre-Registration

All participants in the MRPA-Hershey Track and Field Program are required to register at the local level even if no local meet is being held. ***The local sponsoring agency must send the registrations to the district meet host no later than the Wednesday before the district meet is to be held. A copy-ready registration form is included in this guidebook on pages 8-9.*** Participants pay the optional \$5 donation fee upon check-in at the district meet site.

## C. District Meets

It is encouraged that all participants pre-register, if pre-registered, they *still must check-in at the district meet headquarters*. Check-in time is listed in this guide. Participants may check-in until the start of the meet. Those who fail to check-in will be scratched from their events. Early check-in is advised to prevent any last-minute problems from keeping an individual out of the meet.

## D. State Meet

To qualify for the state meet, individuals must **finish either first, second, third or fourth** in their respective district meets. Participants may advance to the state meet only by way of the district meet.

Participants are eligible to compete at the state meet only in the events in which they placed first, second, third or fourth at their district meet. State meet qualifiers will receive an MRPA packet of information at the district meet explaining how the state meet will be run. They will also receive a map to the location.

Alternates in relays may be changed prior to a heat in the state meet; however, he/she ***must be a representative of the same city or recreation agency***. Alternates in field events and running events other than relays have until June 22 to notify the State Meet host or the State Coordinator. Any alternate changes made after June 22 will not be accepted.

State meet check-in of qualified participants will be from 9:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. At this time, the optional \$5/participant donation fee may be paid, proof-of-age documents will be checked, and the state meet T-shirts will be distributed. Early check-in is advised.

## E. Hershey National Track and Field Meet

State meet champions are ***eligible for selection*** to the team that represents our region in the national meet. Region 1 consists of the states of Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Ohio, Wisconsin, and Ontario, Canada. **NOTE: NOT ALL STATE WINNERS WILL ADVANCE TO THE NATIONAL MEET.** Qualifying participants will be notified as soon as the regional team is selected. A minimum of five participants from Minnesota will be selected for the regional team. Winning an event at the MRPA State Meet does not automatically qualify champions for the National Meet UNLESS the participant places first in the regional results.

**The National Meet will be held July 30-August 2 at Henry Hershey Field in Hershey, Pennsylvania. All expenses for the trip will be paid for by the Hershey Program.**

## IV. Age Verification

Community directors who are sending large groups of participants to a *district* meet are asked to assist meet directors with age verification. Please verify the ages of as many of your community's participants as possible. On your department letterhead, list the participants' names, ages, and documents of verification which you have seen. Place the list in an envelope, seal it, and have it delivered to the meet director at the time of meet registration. Your pre-verification will help speed up the registration process considerably.

Participants qualifying for the *State Meet* must submit a copy of one of the following documents to verify their age:

- Birth certificate/hospital birth record
- Notarized certificate of age from school superintendent or principal on school letterhead
- Baptismal certificate
- Notarized certificate of age from church pastor on church letterhead
- Computer printout from school
- Picture student ID with age of participant on it

State meet participants must bring *copies (do not bring originals as they cannot be returned)* of the documents to the state meet check-in. These documents will be attached to the registration form and retained by the MRPA; if the participant qualifies for the national meet, his/her age can then be immediately verified.

## V. Awards

### A. District Meets

All participants will receive a ribbon of participation; in addition, 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th place finishers will receive winners' ribbons.

### B. State Meet

All MRPA-Hershey State meet participants will receive a T-shirt. Ribbons will be awarded to 1st through 8th place finishers in all events.

## VI. District Meet Procedures

### A. Check-in

Meet hosts should receive registration forms from participating communities prior to the meet so that time can be allowed to fill out the event sheets.

At the check-in table, establish one line for each age group (9-10, 11-12, 13-14). For each participant checking in, do the following:

1. Verify his/her age.
2. Indicate on the event sheet that he/she has checked in.
3. Give him/her a participation ribbon.
4. Give him/her any last minute instructions or reminders.
5. Collect the optional \$5 donation fee.

**REMEMBER THAT PARTICIPANTS WHO FAIL TO CHECK-IN WILL BE SCRATCHED FROM THEIR EVENTS.** Make sure that the final check-in time is well announced.

As soon as the check-in is completed, the event sheets should be given to the supervisor of each event. The meet is now ready to begin.

### B. Events

The public address announcer should call participants to the running events and also periodically remind contestants to take part in their field events.

The running events will be held in the order listed on page 7. The field events may be run concurrently with the running events on a drop-in basis. After all of the participants listed on the field event sheet have competed, the event supervisor should bring the results to the awards table, where the winners will be announced and ribbons will be distributed. The awards for running events should be given out at the conclusion of the last heat of that event.

5. Starter
6. Assistant starter
7. Event workers
  - a. Standing long jump
  - b. Softball throw
  - c. Running events
8. Results table
9. Awards table
10. Trouble shooter

### **D. State Meet Personnel**

The State Meet will need a great deal of help from the districts or other communities hosting local meets. Representatives who would like to volunteer at the State Meet should contact the State Meet Director or the State Chair for more information.

## Regulations

***THE HERSHEY YOUTH PROGRAM IS A BASIC, PLAYGROUND FORM OF PARTICIPATION DESIGNED FOR THE BEGINNING ATHLETE.***

**Eligibility:** Open to boys and girls ages 9-14, *as of December 31 of this year*, who are residents of Minnesota. **All participants must compete in their age group and sex division, and may not compete up. Children participating in a Hershey Track Meet this summer who require accommodations such as an aide, wheelchair access, or an interpreter must contact the local, district, or state meet director at least one week prior to the event so provisions can be made.**

**Equipment:** All participants must wear tennis shoes. The sole may contain grooves, treads, or ridges. Aqua Socks or their variation are allowed, but **spikes of any kind are prohibited**. Shoes that have replaceable spikes are not allowed, even if the spikes are not inserted. No starting blocks are used.

# IX. Event Tips

## A. Running Events

1. At a point near the starting end of the straightaway, the Assistant Starter and an aide should establish the heat staging area. To do this, set up rows of benches and put each heat on one bench. Then move the heats forward from rear to front (5 to 1) as the races progress.

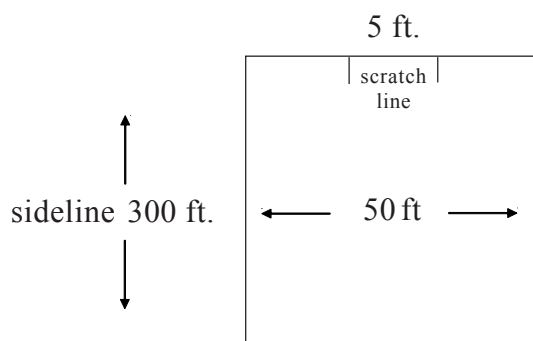

2. After the heats have been set, the aide should walk heat #1 up to the starting line and then go back to get heat #2, etc. \* **Note:** It works best to stage the fastest heat first and work your way down to the slowest heat, if you know the times before the meet. This makes it easier at the end to hand out awards and determine the top five runners.
3. The Starter then gives the command for the start and begins the race. The Assistant starter should periodically give the starter a break.
4. At the end of the first race, inform all runners of their times, and then send the top five to the awards area.
5. After each subsequent race, determine if any runners have beaten any of the top five already in the awards area. If any have, send them over to take their place in the awards area. After each group's event is finished, present the awards and send the results to the press box to be announced and typed.
6. After the contestants have finished the race and/or received their awards, send them out of the running area.
7. Wheelchair athletes must start with all wheels behind the starting line.

## B. Softball Throw

1. Materials needed for this event are as follows: 3 -12' softballs, a clipboard and pencil, a 300' tape, and the event sheet. Softballs must have a minimum circumference of 11-7/8 inches and a maximum of 12-1/8 inches. The minimum weight is 6 oz. with a maximum weight of 6.75oz.
2. Rules
  - a. Each participant is allowed 3 throws -either standing or on the run. (Use flags or stakes to mark throws then measure each throw separately after all three throws are completed).
  - b. Distance is the determining factor in this event.
  - c. A thrower cannot touch the top of the line or go over it with any part of his/her body.
  - d. In case of a tie, the contestant whose next best performance is better than the second-best performance of any other competitor tied for that place shall be declared the winner.

3. Personnel should follow these mechanics during and after each throw:
  - a. Worker #1 checks for throw fouls (2c) and records the distances marked by Worker #2.
  - b. Worker #2 marks the spot where the ball hits. Worker #3 stands at the Center of the five-foot line with the tape measure and measures the distance of the throw where it lands.
  - c. Throws will be conducted in flights. It is suggested that approximately eight competitors make up one flight.
  - d. The throw must be made from inside the five-foot throw marks indicated on the scratch line. The ball must land inside the fifty-foot wide parallel sidelines. The line is out of bounds. The measurement is taken from the center of the five-foot throw marks located on the scratch line to the point touched by the ball which is nearest the scratch line.



### C. Standing Long Jump

1. Materials needed for this event are as follows: a clipboard and pencil, a 50' tape, the event sheet, a rake, and a shovel.
2. Rules
  - a. Each participant is allowed 3 jumps and must take off from behind the scratch line.
  - b. A scratch will be called if any part of the body touches the ground beyond the takeoff board.
  - c. In case of a tie, the contestant whose next best performance is better than the second-best performance of any other competitor tied for that place shall be declared the winner.
3. Personnel should follow these mechanics during and after each jump:
  - a. Worker #1 marks the jump in the landing pit at the spot closest to the takeoff board using the "0" end of the tape and a stick.
  - b. Worker #2 pulls the ruled end of the tape past the takeoff board in a straight line from the point marked in the pit.
  - c. Worker #3 announces each jumper's turn and then reads and records the distance of the jump to the nearest 1/4 inch reading from the front edge of the board.
  - d. Worker #4 rakes the pit smooth after each jump.
